PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE DISCLOSURE STATEMENT

This Disclosure is strictly limited to Southeastern College (SEC) determination of whether the **Certificate in Professional Clinical Massage Therapy** (the “Program”), if successfully completed, would be sufficient to meet the educational requirements for licensure or certification in a State, as defined by 34 C.F.R. § 600.2.

SEC’s Certificate in Professional Clinical Massage Therapy program meets the educational degree completion requirements for certification in the states of Florida, South Carolina and North Carolina as a Licensed Massage Therapist and the designated states below. Southeastern College’s Massage Therapy Programs at the Boynton Beach Beach Campus and Miami Lakes Campus are approved by the Florida Department of Health, Board of Massage Therapy. Students who have successfully met all educational and institutional requirements for a Diploma in Professional Clinical Massage Therapy from Southeastern College are eligible to have their names submitted to the Federation of State Massage Therapy Boards (FSMTB) Massage and Bodywork Licensing Examination (MBLEx) to be eligible to sit for the (MBLEx) examination. Upon passing, the student may apply to The Florida Board of Massage, which is the state agency authorized to determine if the applicant qualifies to become a Licensed Therapist in Florida. Southeastern College’s Professional Clinical Massage Therapy program at the Charlotte, NC Campus is approved by the North Carolina Board of Massage & Bodywork Therapy. Southeastern College’s Professional Clinical Massage Therapy Program at the North Charleston and Columbia Campuses meets the minimum standards for training and curriculum as determined by regulation of the South Carolina Department of Labor Licensing and Regulation, South Carolina/North Carolina Board of Massage & Bodywork Therapy. Students who have successfully met all educational and institutional requirements for a Certificate in Professional Clinical Massage Therapy from Southeastern College are eligible to have their names submitted to the FSMTB to be eligible to sit for the Massage and Bodywork Licensing Examination (MBLEx). Upon passing, the student may apply to The South Carolina/North Carolina Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation- South Carolina/North Carolina Board of Massage/Bodywork Therapy, which is the stage agency authorized to determine if the applicant qualifies to become a Licensed Massage Therapist in South Carolina/North Carolina.
