Enjoy your holiday break, you deserve it!

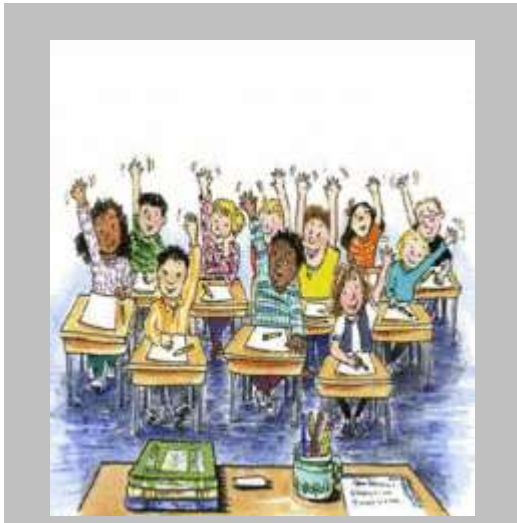
